February Reflection: The Holy Family

Often called the "model of all Christian households" the Holy Family shows us the virtues we all should strive to achieve in our own "domestic Church": parents and children who, for the love of God and neighbor, pray together, love each other, show patience and forgiveness, and above all have a willing attitude of self-sacrifice for those in their home.

The Devotion to the Holy Family began in the 17th century when the Association of the Holy Family was formed in Montreal in 1663. About that same time (1674), the Daughters of the Holy Family formed in Paris.

Later, recognizing the dangers confronting the family, in 1893 Pope Leo XIII approved of the Feast of the Holy Family and he himself composed part of the Office. The idea was that in bringing home to Christians the example of the Holy Family in Nazareth there would be some restoration of the true spirit of family life in order to counteract in some extent the evils in modern society.

More than a century later Pope John Paul II, in his Letter to Families wrote: The history of mankind, the history of salvation passes by way of the family. He stressed how the family is placed at the center of the "great struggle between good and evil between life and death, between love and all that is

and evil, between life and death, between love and all that is opposed to love."

We understand from Sr. Lucia that this final battle between Our Lord and Satan would be a direct assault on marriage and the family. We also understand that Our Lady has already crushed his head. She does this in many ways, but essentially by helping us create a "Nazareth" in our homes of peace and prayer no matter what generations live under the roof.






In case you were not able to speak with them directly, there is still an opportunity for you to secure one or both of the books they have detailing the lives of their founders:

- Sick Calls: \$25
- ❖ Baptisms: \$25-\$50; server stipend optional
- Funerals and Weddings: \$100; \$10-\$20 to each server
- ❖ Organist: \$50. Choir: No stipend recommendation
