# November Reflection: Souls in Purgatory

Prayer is the key by which we open the gates of heaven to the suffering souls. -St. Augustine

One of the most beautiful doctrines in our faith is that of the Communion of Saints. In it we understand more fully the concept of the Mystical Body of Christ, and of the continuous contribution and distribution of merits and graces found in the interdependence among members of the Church Triumphant, the Church Suffering, and the Church Militant.

November gives us cause to reflect on two of the three groups: the Church Triumphant, which we celebrate on Nov. 1 the Feast of All Saints; and the Church Suffering, which is dedicated on Nov. 2 to the Souls in Purgatory.

From the Roman Martyrology we read: On this day is observed the commemoration of the faithful departed, in which our common and pious Mother the Church, immediately after having endeavored to celebrate by worthy praise all her children who already rejoice in heaven, strives to aid by her powerful intercession with Christ, her Lord and Spouse, all those who still groan in Purgatory, so that they may join as soon as possible the inhabitants of the heavenly city.

In fact, so important is this intercession that the Church permits a priest to offer three Masses on this day, and the faithful who go to Confession and Holy Communion may gain a plenary indulgence for the souls in purgatory only.

Our fraternal charity should not be limited to this yearly feast. We can continue to relieve these suffering souls by prayer, fasting, good works, and especially in offering Masses for them. At each Mass the Church places a petition after the consecration "for those who are gone before us, marked with the sign of faith, and sleep the sleep of peace", imploring our Lord to grant them a "place of happiness, light, and peace".




1st Sat of December will be a special schedule as the Sisters will run all groups.
