April Reflection: The Resurrection

All those pious souls who have withstood the rigors of Lent – mourning for sins, doing the work of purification through penance, and following the Cross – have reason to rejoice as the "Feast of Feasts" is finally here. The work of our Redemption is complete as Our Lord triumphantly rises from the dead. The Heavenly Father has accepted Christ's sacrifice and heaven is now opened to us.

It is more than that, though. Bishop Athanasius Schneider, in his book "*Credo*" outlines what the Church has taught regarding the fruits Christ merited for us by his Resurrection, namely that all men may:

- Be delivered from sin
- Be released from the power of the devil
- Be delivered from everlasting death
- Be reconciled with God
- Have the gates of heaven opened to them

This is such tremendous cause for joy among us that the entire Easter week is permeated with the spirit of gladness, and is called the "Solemnity of Solemnities". All Masses within the Octave of Easter are First Class.

As First Friday this month falls within the Octave, Masses

offered that day will be of the "Friday within the Octave of Easter", and not the votive Mass of the Sacred Heart; but the prayers of reparation to the Sacred Heart and associated devotions may certainly still be held.

The even better news is that the faithful continue to celebrate the glories of the Resurrection for a total of seven weeks following Easter Sunday. God is so good!

Focus on Groups: The Archconfraternity of St. Stephen

No ministry, except that of those who by ordination are set apart for the service of the altar, deserves greater thought and consideration than the duty entrusted to those laymen and youths who have the office of assisting the priests of God in the discharge of their sacred functions. It is a ministry of minute detail which must be learnt gradually and fully, both in its external aspect and in the great mystical meanings which it sets forth. (from an Explanation of the Archconfraternity of St. Stephen)

The OLF community is blessed to experience the beauty and majesty in the liturgical ceremonies of the Church throughout the year, but most especially as we have seen in the final week before Easter. From the Palm Sunday procession through the Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday services, OLF had many opportunities to tap into the fullness of graces offered in the Triduum.

So much of what we have comes in part because of the dedication of the boys and young men of the Archconfraternity of St. Stephen, OLF's acolyte group.

Established in 1905 by Fr. Hamilton MacDonald of Westminster Cathedral in London, the Archconfraternity of St. Stephen is a guild which, through a careful and methodical process, teaches servers how to reverently discharge their duties at Mass or other liturgical functions. The Archbishop of Westminster, Francis Bourne (later Cardinal), was so impressed by the Guild, that he petitioned Pope St. Pius X for his Apostolic Blessing for the Confraternity. The Holy Father granted this in his own handwriting on November 5th, 1905.

In joining the guild, boys not only learn the responses and duties of their rank, but also the significance and purpose of the ceremonies at which they assist. The guild offers an opportunity for their members to grow in their love and dedication to the honor and glory of God. Membership has its own responsibilities as well and servers are required to:

- To serve at the Altar reverently, intelligently and punctually.
- To make the short acts of preparation before, and of thanksgiving after, serving Mass.
- To observe silence in the sacristy, and great reverence in the Sanctuary.
- To recite daily the Guild Prayer.

- Mass Offering: \$20 (include intentions with payment and mail/give to priest or give to servers/ushers who will make sure Father gets it)
- Sick Calls: \$25
- ✤ Baptisms: \$25-\$50; server stipend optional
- ✤ Funerals and Weddings: \$100; \$10-\$20 to each server
- Organist: \$50. Choir: No stipend recommendation
 To reiterate, these are *recommendations only and not required, but appreciated*.
 Certainly be as generous as you are able to our priests and their helpers!


