November Reflection: Closing Out the Liturgical Year

The waning days of Pentecost find the Church calling to our minds the four last things: Death, Judgment, Heaven, Hell; and indeed the liturgy in November is rife with images of our soul's final end.

The month's joyful opening with the Feast of All Saints (Nov. 1) is a glorious tribute to those holy souls whom the Church has deemed to be enjoying everlasting blessedness in heaven. Within 24 hours, however, the image turns to those souls still suffering, not as the militant suffer, but as those in the final purge of the cleansing fires before admittance to the Beatific Vision. (Feast of the Holy Souls Nov 2).

November also celebrates three saints who are Doctors of the Church, whose timeless legacy of a holy life and their doctrinal writings are inspirations for us:

- St. Albert the Great (Nov. 15) had a great devotion to Our Lady, used science to serve the Faith, wrote treatises on the Mass, and was teacher to the great Doctor of the Church, St. Thomas Aquinas.
- St. Gertrude the Great (Nov. 16 and the only female saint with this title) acquired a tremendous knowledge of theology and the sciences; was a mystic, had devotion to the Passion of Christ, the Holy Eucharist, and to Our Lady.
- St. John of the Cross (Nov 24), was persuaded by St. Teresa of Avila to join the Carmelite Order in order to help in its reformation, endured many trials, had a devotion to Our Lord's Passion, and "voluntarily sought out humiliations".

No month in the Catholic calendar would be complete without honoring Our Lady, whose Feasts of the Presentation (Nov. 21) and Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal (Nov. 27) are celebrated; dates that close out the Liturgical Season of Pentecost, and in a sense usher in the coming Season of Advent.



A Word About Stipends

As a matter of justice, our priests should be compensated for activities performed outside of bringing the Mass to us. Here are recommendations.

- Mass offering: \$20 (include intentions with payment and mail/give to priest or give to servers/ushers who will make sure Father gets it)
- Sick Calls: \$25
- ♦ Baptisms: \$25-\$50; server stipend optional
- ✤ Funerals and Weddings: \$100; \$10-\$20 to each server
- ♦ Organist: \$50. Choir: No stipend recommendation

To reiterate, these are *recommendations only and not required, but appreciated*. Certainly be as generous as you are able to our priests and their helpers!

Helping the Souls in Purgatory: All Souls' Day Indulgences

From noon of All Saint's' Day until midnight of All Souls' Day, those who have confessed and received Holy Communion on either side of the two days or within the following octave may gain the *toties quoties* indulgence: a plenary indulgence (under usual conditions) *applied only to the Souls in Purgatory* when one visits a church or public chapel, and prays 6 Our Fathers, 6 Hail Marys, and 6 Glorias for the intention of Holy Mother Church.

The indulgence may also be gained from noon of the following Saturday until Sunday midnight, but only by those who didn't gain the indulgence on All Souls' Day. (Raccolta 590)

The faithful, who during the period of 8 days from the commemoration of All Souls' inclusive, may gain for the faithful departed a plenary indulgence if they visit a cemetery and, in a spirit of piety and devotion, pray, even mentally, for the dead. (Raccolta 592)

Those who recite prayers or perform other devout exercises in supplication for the faithful departed during November may gain an indulgence. (Raccolta 589)

Those who, in November, take part in public services held in a church or oratory in intercession for the faithful departed may gain an indulgence if they attend these services on at least 15 days, and in addition go to Confession, receive Holy Communion, and pray for the intentions of Holy Mother Church. (Raccolta 589)


The faithful who devoutly offer prayers at any season of the year in intercession for the souls of the faithful departed, with the intention of so continuing for 7 or 9 successive days may obtain an indulgence. (Raccolta 588)

Hall and blessed be the hour and moment when the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour, vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother. Amen
