August Reflection: The Blessed Sacrament

In the last two months the Church has brought to the faithful for spiritual meditation Our Lord's Sacred Heart and Precious Blood, and in celebrating Trinity Sunday and the Feast of Corpus Christi. It seems very appropriate, then, that August be dedicated to that sacrament that brings all of these dedications together.

For what is the Blessed Sacrament but the Body (Corpus Christi), Blood (Precious Blood), Soul (Sacred Heart), and Divinity (Trinity Sunday) of Christ? How then, can we best give honor and tribute to so great a sacrament and a sacrifice?

The practice of the Eucharistic Holy Hour is long-standing in the Church, and was promoted through the efforts of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1673. The Archconfraternity of the Holy Hour was established by Pere Robert Debrosse in 1829. In 1911 it received the right of aggregation for the entire world. Pope Pius X granted an indulgence to the practice in 1909.

Spending time with Jesus as He resides in the tabernacle, or even just at home quietly meditating on the graces He gives us in the *sacrament of the altar* is simple and profound. We have a tremendous opportunity to give honor, praise, love, and reparation to Our Lord in the monthly Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Holy Hour on First Fridays.

If you have not availed yourself of this opportunity, perhaps it is worth your consideration.

"Could you not watch one hour with Me?" Our Lord asked His Apostles. He asks no less of us.





OLF Groups

The summer is flying fast, and it is time for our Groups to begin planning for the coming year. Below is a list and short description of Groups organized to promote a deeper Catholic experience for our faithful of all ages.

Holy Name Society: For the men of our parish, this group supports Father through prayers and responsibilities surrounding the physical Church. They are our ushers. They lead the Rosary and prayers before Masses. More men are always a welcome addition; there is no fee to join and you usually get fed during your monthly meetings with Father.

Prayer Crusade for Priests: This apostolate meets on the first Thursday of the month in a holy hour dedicated to the spiritual support of our priests as well as an appeal to Our Lord for more vocations.

For our Littles: In addition to the Catechism Program, OLF offers these opportunities for our children to come together to develop their spiritual life. There are fees attached to these groups to cover the costs of activities done every 1st Saturday October - May.

- Children of Mary: Every 3rd Saturday, a group of ladies (age 13-18) travel to Veneta to spend the day with the Sisters at St. Thomas Becket. The day includes: Holy Mass, meditations, activities. It's edifying and fun. They also gather every 1st Saturday for Mass, mediations and a meeting.
- ♦ Blue Knights and Little Flowers: Clubs for boys and girls 5-12 that teaches virtues through Scripture, saint's biographies, and the catechism. Consists of 4 years of study. Each year the children focus on virtues, the lives of the saints, make crafts and eat delicious snacks.
- **St. Theresa's Little Garden:** To provide an authentically Catholic "little school" for little folks (ages 2-6) that cultivates a sense of wonder through play, nature observation, good literature and poetry. (Also provides some social time the for the mothers) Lots of outdoor play, storytime, poetry, show and tell.

Excelsior Speech Club (Toastmasters): For our 13-19 year olds, Toastmasters provide a supportive and positive learning experience in which members are empowered to develop communication and leadership skills, resulting in greater self-confidence and personal growth.
