# March Reflection: Opposition and Opportunity

An interesting thing about March: on the one hand, it is a month rich with feast days that give us cause for celebration – St. Joseph, The Annunciation, and (for some) St. Patrick. Most of us take great delight in indulging these festivals with fun and food.

On the other hand, March is a month that calls us to penance and mortification as we prepare for the most important event in the Liturgical Year - Easter. The Church in her wisdom has required souls to offer acts of sacrifice through prayer, almsgiving, fasting, and abstinence in the 40 days that comprise the Lenten Season. In modern times these laws are a walk in the park, yet how many of us still balk and make excuses for not snacking between meals, or complain about having meat once a day (except none on Fridays), or two small meals which together do not equal the principal meal?

In previous ages Church laws on fast and abstinence were quite severe. One meal a day. No flesh meat at all (including animal products). No eggs. No butter. No cheese. No milk. No fun, right?

Putting this in perspective: If the soul and the body are both complicit in offending God, then both must suffer to truly make our reparation and conversion of heart complete. It only makes sense, then, that during Lent, while the soul strives through prayer and works of mercy to effect this change, the body, through fast and abstinence, does its part as well. In the words of Dom Prosper Gueranger:

The Christian should, therefore, during Lent, study to excite himself to repentance of heart, and look upon it as the essential foundation of all his Lenten exercises. Nevertheless, he must remember that this spiritual penance would be a mere delusion, were he not to practice mortification of the body. Let him study the example given him by his Saviour, who grieves, indeed, and weeps over our sins; but He also expiates them by His bodily sufferings. Hence it is that the Church, the infallible interpreter of her divine Master's will, tells us that the repentance of our heart will not be accepted by God, unless it be accompanied by fasting and abstinence.



- 5th Sunday: As needed for special need. (will be taken up on 2nd Sun)


# Focus on Groups: Book Clubs and the Importance of Good Reading





- ❖ Organist: \$50. Choir: No stipend recommendation
