August Reflection: The Immaculate Heart of Mary

Flesh of my flesh; Heart of my heart; My Son let me die with you. (from The Passion of the Christ)

Whether or not our Blessed Mother uttered these words as Our Lord hung on the Cross, they nonetheless provoke us to reflect on the powerful tie there is between the hearts of the Mother and the Son.

The Church, having given us in June and July cause to consider Our Lord's Sacred Heart and Precious Blood, now turns our attention to their human source: the Blessed Mother and her Immaculate Heart.

Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is long-standing. St. John Eudes obtained approval of the feast for his congregation in 1668; Pope Pius VII approved it for certain religious orders and dioceses in 1805. Finally in 1942 Pope Pius XII consecrated the human race to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and extended the feast to the entire Church. August 22, which had until that time been celebrated as the Octave of the Assumption became the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

In her glorious and rightful place as hyperdulia among the Church Triumphant and the heavenly court, Our Lady exerts her power and influence for those of us still struggling in the Church Militant. As St. Bernardine of Siena writes:

The glorious Virgin has as many subjects as the Blessed Trinity has. Every creature, whatever he its rank in creation, spiritual as angels, rational as man, material as the heavenly hodies or the elements, heaven and earth, the reprobate and the blessed, all that springs from the power of God, is subject to the Virgin. For he who is the Son of God and of the Blessed Virgin, wishing, so to say, to make His Mother's principality in some sort equal to the Father's, hecame, God as He is, the servant of Mary. If then, it he true to say that everyone, even the Virgin, obeys God, we may also convert the proposition, and affirm that everyone, even God, obeys the Virgin. (from The Liturgical Year, Octive of the Assumption)

Fr. Madanat's Vacation: Aug 16 - Sept 5.


Visiting Priests: Welcome Frs. S. McDonald & Chavarria. Make sure to say hello!

Focus on Groups: Parent Patrol

Many of us have heard about or maybe even seen the Paw Patrol: an animated group of rescue puppies who work together to keep their community safe. These characters believe that there is "no job too big, and no pup too small" to be able to help when help is needed.

While we are not animated characters out of a children's program, we all know that keeping the OLF community safe is a high priority.

Thanks to the efforts of the Holy Name Society with the monthly car washes, and donations to the Capital Campaign, money is being earned to help renovate the outside playground space so children of all ages can do what children do best: run and play and expend the energy some of the older OLFsters only wish they still had.

In the interim and going forward, it is important that the children have a safe place to play. It is even more important that they are supervised. Corralling them in an outside pen with no oversight isn't the answer.

Parents need to be involved in this process. In order to keep good order while children are at church, the **Parent Patrol** has been formed so that our children (and frail adults) are kept safe. Their motto:

There is no <u>supervision job</u> too small, no <u>parent</u> too big to be able to help keep all OLFsters safe when safety is needed.

OLF is doing her part to create safe spaces for children to be and play, but parents will still need to be vigilant with their children.

It is not unreasonable for parents to take one Saturday/Sunday a month to oversee safety at the church. *We need someone to take lead of this group.* If you have any questions, see APR Head Dr. Cleary or our Coordinators Joe & Aggie.


